Senator Bob Casey, Representative Susan Wild Receive 2022 NAEMT EMS Legislator of the Year Awards

Clinton, Miss. — Today, the National Association of Emergency Medical Technicians (NAEMT) honored Senator Bob Casey (D-PA) and Representative Susan Wild (D-PA) as recipients of the 2022 NAEMT EMS Legislator of the Year Award during the virtual EMS On The Hill Day Briefing. EMS On The Hill Day is the largest national advocacy event for emergency medical services (EMS) professionals.

This prestigious award recognizes members of Congress who demonstrate an outstanding commitment to, and support of, high-quality prehospital and out-of-hospital emergency medical care, as well as the EMS professionals who dutifully serve our nation's patients. Senator Casey and Representative Wild are receiving this award for their leadership in introducing the EMS Counts Act of 2021 in both the U.S. House and Senate. This legislation will improve the ability of our states and communities to effectively utilize their EMS workforce to care for the sick and injured and respond to major disasters and public health crises.
