Jon R. Krohmer, MD, Receives NAEMT's Most Prestigious 2025 Rocco V. Morando Lifetime Achievement Award

Ridgeland, Miss. — Jon R. Krohmer, MD, FACEP, FAEMS, will be recognized today with the 2025 Rocco V. Morando Lifetime Achievement Award for his exceptional contributions and solid leadership in the field of Emergency Medical Services (EMS). The award is NAEMT's most prestigious, generously sponsored by the National Registry of Emergency Medical Technicians (National Registry). The presentation will be made during NAEMT's General Membership Meeting and 50th Anniversary celebration in Indianapolis, Indiana, held in conjunction with EMS World Expo.

Dr. Krohmer, a board-certified emergency and EMS physician, retired in 2022 after a distinguished 45-year career in EMS and public policy. He has served as the director of the Office of EMS at the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), the EMS Medical Director for the Caroline County (MD) Department of Emergency Services, the NHTSA Acting Associate Administrator for Research and Program Development, president of the National Association of EMS Physicians, and as a senior leader with the U.S. Department of Homeland Security.

Throughout his career, Dr. Krohmer has been instrumental in advancing EMS through initiatives such as EMS Agenda 2050, the National EMS Information System, revisions to the National EMS Education Standards, and the National EMS Scope of Practice Model. His leadership has been pivotal in strengthening the EMS community.

Chief Christopher Way, BS, President of NAEMT, said: "Dr. Krohmer's enduring dedication to patient care, the EMS community, and the organizations that support them both exemplifies a lifetime of meaningful service and achievement. He has been a true ambassador, helping to carry forward the best of our EMS history while shaping the future of our profession. Honoring him with this award is not only a recognition of his lifetime of service, but also a celebration of the enduring impact he has had on the health and safety of communities across our nation."

Dr. Krohmer chairs the Prehospital Blood Transfusion Coalition and is Associate Medical Editor for NAEMT's Advanced Medical Life Support (AMLS) course. He previously served as an attending physician and Director of EMS, Emergency Medicine Residency, and the Department of Emergency Medicine at Spectrum Health Butterworth in Grand Rapids, MI. He was also EMS Medical Director for Kent County and the West Michigan Metropolitan Medical Response System. He earned his pharmacy degree from Ferris State, his medical degree from the University of Michigan, and completed his emergency medicine residency and EMS fellowship at Wright State University. Dr. Krohmer is also an Adjunct Professor of Emergency Medicine at Michigan State University and remains active in EMS-related initiatives.
